Affordable Healthcare Enrollment

About the Health Insurance Marketplace

- ⇒ The Health Insurance Marketplace is for people who don't have health coverage
- ⇒ What you pay for insurance depends on your income and you'll probably save
- ⇒ You can apply for coverage 4 ways Online, by phone, with in-person help, or with a paper application.
- ⇒ If you don't have health insurance, you may have to pay a fee of whichever is higher between 2.5% of your income or \$695 per adult.

Eligibility

To be eligible to enroll in health coverage through the Marketplace, you:

- ⇒ Must live in the United States
- ⇒ Must be a U.S. citizen or national (or be lawfully present).
- ⇒ Can't be incarcerated.

If you have Medicare coverage, you're **not** eligible to use the Marketplace to buy a health or dental plan.

Important dates for 2016 enrollment

- ⇒ **November 1, 2015:** Open Enrollment started first day you can enroll in a 2016 insurance plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace. Coverage can start as soon as January 1, 2016.
- ⇒ **December 15, 2015:** Last day to enroll in or change plans for new coverage to start January 1, 2016
- ⇒ **January 1, 2016:** 2016 coverage starts for those who enroll or change plans by December 15.
- ⇒ January 15, 2016: Last day to enroll in or change plans for new coverage to start February 1, 2016
- ⇒ **January 31, 2016:** 2016 Open Enrollment ends. Enrollments or changes between January 16 and January 31 take effect March 1, 2016.
- ⇒ If you don't enroll in a 2016 health insurance plan by January 31, 2016, you can't enroll in a health insurance plan for 2016 unless you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.

A **Special Enrollment Period** is a time outside of the open enrollment period during which you and your family have a right to sign up for health coverage. In the Marketplace, you qualify for a special enrollment period 60 days following certain life events that involve a change in family status (for example, marriage or birth of a child) or loss of other health coverage. Job-based plans must provide a special enrollment period of 30 days.
