# Physical & Mental Health



#### April is Alcohol Awareness Month.

Drinking too much alcohol increases people's risk of injuries, violence, drowning, liver disease, and some types of cancer. This April during Alcohol Awareness Month, we encourage you to educate yourself and your loved ones about the dangers of drinking too much.

Alcohol is the most commonly used addictive substance in the United States: 17.6 million people, or one in every 12 adults, suffer from alcohol abuse or dependence along with several million more who engage in risky, binge drinking patterns that could lead to alcohol problems. 88,000 deaths are annually attributed to excessive alcohol use with Alcoholism being the 3<sup>rd</sup> leading lifestyle-related cause of death in the nation.

Alcohol abuse and alcoholism can affect all aspects of a person's life. Over time, excessive alcohol use can lead to numerous health problems, chronic diseases, neurological impairments and social problems.



Here are some strategies to help you or someone you may know cut back or quit drinking:

- Limit your drinking to no more than 1 drink a day for women and 2 drinks a day for men
- Learn the definition of a "standard drink"
- Recognize the signs of harmful alcohol use
- Don't drink when you are upset
- Limit the amount of alcohol you keep at home
- Avoid places where people drink a lot
- Make a list of reasons not to drink
